QUARTERLY REPORT Q3 2015


A quarterly comparison finds a decline in residential foreclosure deeds filed in the third quarter of 2015 when compared to 2014's third quarter. Looking at Q3 2015, there were 184 foreclosure deeds filed which is a fifty-two percent decline from Q3 2014 when there were 382 filed deeds.¹ There was a decline in the number of actual residential foreclosure deeds filed in Rhode Island in the first three quarters of 2015 from the first three quarters in 2014. There were 905 residential foreclosure deeds filed between Q1 and Q3 of 2015, twenty-eight percent less than in the first three quarters of 2014.

Locally, 9 municipalities and the East Side of Providence reported increases in actual foreclosure deeds filed in the first three quarters of 2015 when compared to the same time period in 2014. Twenty-nine municipalities experienced decreases, and one saw no change at all.


While the percent of loans that were seriously delinquent continued to decline, in Q3 of 2015 Rhode Island was 2nd in New England. Nationally, Rhode Island ranks 5th for seriously delinquent loans. At 4.96 percent Rhode Island surpassed that national figure of 3.57 percent.²
